He is currently working on Geomicrobiology and the role of bacteria in cave and karst formation, the life cycle of *Cerion* and use of stable isotopes in *Cerion* shells for paleoclimatic reconstruction, and stable isotopes in Bahamian speleothems. He has also recently been published in the 12th Symposium in the Geology of the Bahamas and Other Carbonate Regions.
